FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK:



The Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ, popularly called by its Latin title, *Corpus Christi* ("Body of Christ"), is celebrated on the second Sunday after Pentecost. Its origin in the 12th century is connected with an emphasis on the real presence of Christ in the consecrated bread to be adored to the exclusion of a fuller meaning of Eucharist as celebration, a meal to be eaten. People in the Middle Ages, feeling unworthy to receive Christ in communion, preferred to look at the Blessed Sacrament. This led to the introduction of an elevation of the bread and cup during Mass and ultimately to public displays such as the popular Benediction ritual. The special feast devoted to the Body and Blood of Christ was introduced to the universal church in 1264. A tradition says that St. Thomas Aquinas wrote the prayers and hymns for the feast. Today the former Feast of the Precious Blood on July 1 is incorporated in this solemnity. (p 102 of Catholic Customs and Traditions)

The Corpus Christi procession developed from this Solemnity as early as the 13th century. It was popular to process, carrying the Blessed Sacrament, visibly in a vessel called a Monstrance which "showed" the Body of Christ. The procession would move from station to station, giving the people an opportunity to "look upon the Body of Christ". The motive for the procession was to publicly display a personal faith in the Real Presence. This is not a liturgical ritual, but has become popular again, even though the Council of Vatican II recaptured the full meaning of the Eucharist as a meal to eat the consecrated bread and drink his blood, where allowed. We have much to remember and understand about our religion and faith. God bless you all. Fr. Don Buhrman

Food for Thought

Pope Benedict XVI put it well at a 2008 audience: "We are only Christians if we encounter Christ. Of course, he does not show himself to us in this overwhelming, luminous way, as he did to Paul to make him the apostle to all peoples. CONTINUUM OF CARE: For more than 20 years St. Leo’s has hosted Grand Island’s Continuum of Care (COC) meetings on a monthly basis. Those involved in these meetings are local non-profits, churches and other agencies that help people in our community. There is usually a speaker who presents to the group about their agency. We also talk about tough situations that we may have so all the agencies can brainstorm the best ways to help individuals and families. It’s a great way to partner with other agencies. For the next couple of months, I will be introducing you to the agencies that are involved in the COC.

Local Shelters

CROSSROADS: They have shelters in Kearney, Hastings and Grand Island. Crossroads is a Christian organization. The Grand Island shelter is for men only.



HOPE HARBOR: They provide shelter for women and families. They also provide community assistance for anyone men and women (food boxes, hygiene, baby formula, diapers, furniture when available, household items, gas vouchers for medical and immigration appointments) All their services are free.



Emergency shelter: Very short term, check in at 7 pm, check out at 8 am. A resident can stay for up to 30 days.

Transitional shelter: A resident can stay for up to 9 months. They will work with a case manager to obtain self-sufficiency. They will attend life-skill education classes. Each resident is assigned a daily chore and community service.



Willow Rising: Shelter for those fleeing domestic violence. They also provide victim services such as safety services, self-sufficiency services, and responsive services. Some of those services is advocating for the victim when needed, providing a protection order, budgeting, career services, providing support groups and advocate victims going through hearings or trials. They also provide prevention & education, youth services, Adult Education, and Intervention Programs.
