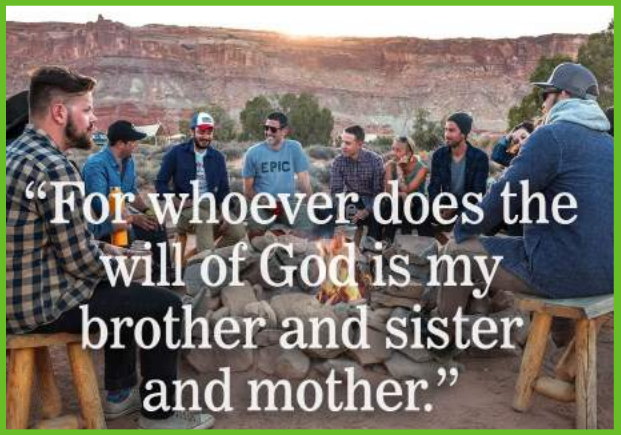

Fr. Paul Gins, OSM, (Order Friar Servants of Mary) will be the homilist June 15-16 for the 2024 Servite Mission Appeal for Zululand. The order began with seven cloth merchants outside Florence, Italy, in 1233. Known as the Seven Holy Founders, canonized in 1888, their Feast Day is Feb. 17. The most well-known Servite Saint is St. Peregrine Laziosi, OSM, patron of those with cancer and life-threatening illness. Work began in the Vicariate of Ingwavuma, Zululand, Natal, South Africa in 1948. Our Servite Mission Appeals support the daily ministry to the Zulu Catholics in the Vicariate, the evangelization of the non-Catholic and the formation of Service seminarians.
