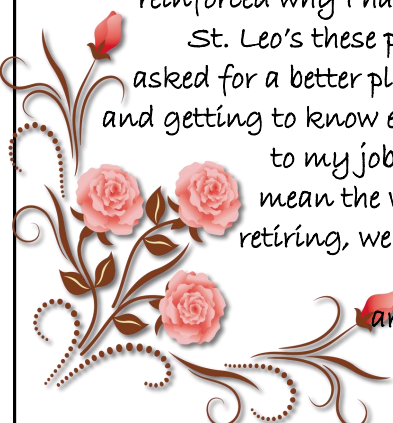

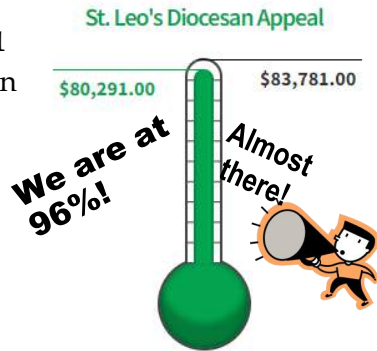
2023/24 Diocesan Appeal Update as of 7/22/24
