Yearly flu vaccination is the best tool currently available to protect against influenza (flu), a serious disease which sickens millions of people each year.

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) recommends a yearly flu vaccination as the first and most important step in protecting against flu and its potentially serious complications. Millions of people have safely received flu vaccines for decades. Flu vaccination can reduce flu illnesses, doctors' visits, and missed work and school due to flu, as well as prevent flu-related hospitalizations.

Reasons to get a flu vaccine:

- Flu vaccination can keep you from getting sick from flu.
- Flu vaccination can reduce the risk of flu-associated hospitalization, including among children and older adults.



- Flu vaccination is an important preventive tool for people with chronic health conditions.
- Vaccination helps protect women during and after pregnancy. Getting vaccinated also protects the baby several
 months after birth.
- Flu vaccination also may make your illness milder if you do get sick.
- Getting vaccinated yourself also protects people around you, including those who are more vulnerable to serious flu
 illness, like babies and young children, older people, and people with certain chronic health conditions.

Capital Campaign Update:

Thank you very much for all the support the parish has shown in completing the campaign pledge drive and for the contributions that have already been received. God bless you.

As you can tell the parking lot portion of the Capital Campaign is nearly complete. The concrete is poured and finished. Finishing touches with the grounds is nearing. Thank you very much for the generous support offered for this first phase. We have already collected enough to pay the full bill.

The two remaining parts of the Capital Campaign are the replacement of the accordion walls in the Parish Hall as well as replacing the shake shingle roof of the whole complex. Information is still being gathered in regards to the Parish Hall walls. Once the decision is made on what to do and the bid is accepted we will schedule the change. As of now, the earliest could be over the Christmas break but more likely next spring or summer. That will provide sufficient time for the funds to keep coming in so we can pay the bill on time.



The final phase of the Campaign will be to replace the roof. As of now the roof does not leak. Since we do not have the funds in hand we will wait until the pledges are complete. At the earliest we will work for the summer of 2018 but may wait till 2019 when all the funds are in.

<u>RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS (RCIA)</u> "CATECHUMENATE PROCESS"

The RCIA/CATECHUMENATE process is designed to be an introduction to Catholicism. It is a restoration of an ancient process of the early church. The first purpose is to provide an experience of God's love. Evangelization is the key to RCIA, ie, to proclaim the good news of Jesus Christ. It is likened to the journey of the disciples on the road to Emmaus. During the journey they pondered the Scriptures, how they related to their lives, and finally recognized the Lord in the breaking of the bread.

The RCIA involves a team approach. Teachings are done, not only by priests and sisters, but by the lay people as well. The core materials this year are from the DVD series, *Symbolon* produced by the Augustine Institute in Denver, CO. This is a community experience and members of the community assist in leading the sessions and guiding the discussions. All will share in the faith journey. This gives the participants the important experience of other lay people sharing their faith, and the dimension of knowledge and experience that comes from their lives. Hopefully the result is an experience of Christian community.

Here at St. Leo's Church the RCIA program will start September 28th and runs through Easter, in the Spring. The sessions are held on Thursday nights from 7pm to 8:30pm in the Gather Room. Interested candidates and their sponsors will gather at that time. A teaching on a particular topic will be presented followed by discussion time.

Every candidate will need a Catholic sponsor to journey with them through this process. The Sponsor must be a Catholic who has all the Sacraments of Initiation, practices their faith and is able to communicate regularly with the candidate. The Sponsor is not to be a spouse and is highly encouraged to participate in the sessions if at all possible.

Fr. Don Buhrman is the Coordinator. Fr. Mark Maresh, Michelle Matthews and Zac Peirce are part of the team that will journey with you. If you are interested in this process please call the office at 382-4753 for more information. Fr. Don will be happy to meet with you and visit about your involvement with RCIA.

Reminder from the Finance Council:

A charitable contribution of long-term appreciated securities — i.e. stocks, bonds and/or mutual funds that have realized significant appreciation over time — is one of the most tax-efficient of all ways to give. This method of giving has become increasingly popular in recent years.

The two key advantages:

 Any long-term appreciated securities with unrealized gains (meaning they were purchased over a year ago, and have a current value greater than their original cost) may be donated to a public charity and a tax deduction taken for the full fair market value of the securities — up to 30% of the donor's adjusted gross income.

• Since the securities are donated rather than sold, capital gains taxes from selling the securities no longer apply. The more appreciation the securities have, the greater the tax savings will be.

WHAT IF PARENTS received an email from your activity director stating Junior High and High School students may only practice band, cheerleading, dance, football, musicals, volleyball, golf and cross country for one hour a week this fall? However, imagine if you did only practice an hour a week? Would that prepare you for upcoming activities?? NOT EVEN CLOSE!! Please practice your faith for more than an hour on Sunday at Mass. Can you read the life-changing Gospels 15 minutes a day? Can you eat lunch with someone sitting alone at a table? Can you pray an "Our Father" out loud on your way to school as a family and offer your day to God? Can you do chores around your home without being asked to do them? Can you read about the Saints? Can you help a neighbor in need? Practice your faith more than one hour a week.



At St Leo's it is our challenge to provide positive, safe and educational programs for our parishioners. The bonus is that we also attempt to make it fun, lively and worthwhile. We've had many compliments over the years that kids, youth and even adults enjoy the programs we have, asking for more! One of the best compliments we've received (several times, every year) is "We only had to MAKE our child go to ______(fill in the blank – RE Class, Empower Youth, confirmation)______ one time, after that they **WANT** to go/never question about going/get sad when it's a week off/can't wait to go ... etc. "We've heard several variations. \bigcirc

We know the love of God is burning heavily in their hearts, even though they may not know it **we** know it, but we also know they are **wanting** to participate because of the experiences and the relationships they are building by attending these programs. Sometimes it is the information, i.e. the education, that draws them; but 90% of the time it is the relationship connection that is huge draw.

And that's ok, because "Wherever two or more are gathered in my name, I am there in the midst...."

We are not only building relationships with each other by attending these RE Programs, but we are developing, deepening our relationship with the **Father**, **the Son** and **the Holy Spirit**!

We are **PREP**ping ourselves to become, to continue to live our lives as disciples participating in the life, mission and work of the Catholic faith community. We are **PREP**aring for growth in our spiritual and personal lives.

In our Elementary **PREP** – we are engaging our children by helping them find God & Jesus in the world around them. Sometimes this involves games, crafts or other tactical learning. Other times it involves reading, discussing, and dissecting Scripture, the Catechism, or the world around them. In all ways, the children are learning, developing and engaging in what it means to be a **Catholic** Child of God.

In our Empower Youth **PREP** – we strive to bring the world around them into our Catholic Faith. We delve into how as Catholic's do we view, integrate and live in THEIR world. 



Parish Registration



Are you registered at St. Leo's? For Baptisms, Sponsor letters, Weddings, and Funerals, belonging to a parish is the first requirement. People are sometimes surprised when they move to another city and want to have a Baptism or Wedding in a parish, but are not allowed to because they do not belong to that parish. Most all Catholic ministry is based on the parish you belong to. Most

dioceses follow the basic law of the church about parish boundaries, so you belong to the parish that you live in. Whatever parish you choose, it's important to make a commitment to that parish, and be actively involved. We are happy to give permission for Baptism at another parish or to do Baptisms for family members from another parish, but a letter of permission from the proper Pastor is needed. Please make sure you are registered at your parish.

Catholic Social Teaching: Rights and Responsibilities

Catholic tradition teaches that human dignity can be protected and a healthy community can be achieved only if human rights are protected and responsibilities are met. Therefore, every person has a fundamental right to life and a right to those things required for human decency. Corresponding to these rights are duties and responsibilities — to one another, to our families, and to the larger society. In simpler terms, this means people have a fundamental right to life, food, shelter, health care, education and employment.

One way to help is Food for Thought, the program where we take bags of food to Starr Elementary each week for children who do not have enough to eat. This is about a once every two month commitment. You pick up the bags from the Salvation Army and deliver them to Starr. If you are interested or if you would like more information, please call Donna Douglass at 308-382-4753.

Another way to work toward providing the right of education is Stuff the Bus which was just held in the beginning of August. 
